



COMMON DYNAMIC MARKINGS

<u>Name</u>	<u>Symbol</u>	<u>Meaning</u>
pianissimo	<i>pp</i>	very soft
piano	<i>p</i>	soft
mezzo piano	<i>mp</i>	moderately soft
mezzo forte	<i>mf</i>	slightly loud
forte	<i>f</i>	loud
fortissimo	<i>ff</i>	very loud
fortepiano	<i>fp</i>	loud then soft
sforzando	<i>sfz</i>	sudden accent
crescendo		gradually louder
diminuendo		gradually softer

Note: Dynamic markings come from Italian Language.
The suffix “issimo” means "very". Sometimes it is also used as “ississimo” which means very, very.
