fortissimo	ff	very loud
fortepiano	fp	loud then soft
sforzando	s <b>f</b> z	sudden accent
crescendo	$ \leftarrow $	gradually louder
diminuendo	>	gradually softer

Note: Dynamic markings come from Italian Language. The suffix "issimo" means "very". Sometimes it is also used as "ississimo" which means very, very.
